

Dirty oil polluter nabbed

The owner of a Silverglen company was issued a fine after allegedly dumping truck oil into a T-shaped trench.

Environmental, community and civic organisations have lashed out at a local trucking company after truck oil was allegedly being disposed into a trench at the Silverglen company's premises, last week.

The owner of the trucking company was fined R5,000 by Metro Police and R2,000 by the Department of Environmental Health for incorrectly disposing of used oil into a T-shaped trench, which was dug out about two months ago.

Heads of environmental groups and other civic and community bodies rallied to inspect the area after the oil was found in the trench and expressed their concern when they saw the extent of the pollution threat to the catchment area, which is located about 400m from the Silverglen Nature Reserve.

A fuming chairman of the Silverglen Conservancy, Shaun Hammond, said he was disgusted when he saw the extent of the pollution and the threat to the catchment area.

"This is the reason why community NGOs, like

civics and ratepayer associations, need to take on the extra responsibility of protecting their environment from people who are out to destroy it. Civic bodies need to educate their communities on reporting any untoward activity to them so that the relevant action can be taken," said Hammond.

The Silverglen Conservancy has an effective informer network that provides tip-offs regarding any environmental atrocity within its footprint. Hammond warned that if there are serious contraventions against the National Environmental Act or National Environmental Biodiversity Act, fines go into millions of rands and perpetrators could even face imprisonment.

"This incident has opened a can of worms regarding invasion of council property and other serious council usage concerns. This is the third incident relating to crimes against the environment that we were tipped off about this year and immediately attended to. Being an endangered area as far as the conservancy is concerned, the

area is now being heavily monitored. The Silverglen Conservancy works closely with the Department of Water Affairs, the Green Scorpions and eThekwini Environmental Health, Metro Police and Pollution Control and Enforcement," added Hammond.

Wanted hijacking suspect arrested

According to Pillay, a similar event of this nature took place in May, this year, and due to the success of the initiative, he is confident that he can make the next initiative even bigger and better.

Speaking to Pillay, who is also a teacher at Astra Primary School, he said that losing a loved one to cancer is a painful and difficult experience but nevertheless, it has helped him and his family to strengthen their bond and appreciate every day given to them.

At the recent family fun day, my team and I managed to raise a total of R10,000 which was then donated to the Chatsworth Regional Hospice Association. Next year's event will take place on April 7, 2018, which is also my brother's birthday. He would have turned 21 so it's the perfect date to host the event. The venue has yet to be confirmed. I do know that I want to do things a bit differently," he explained. His target for next year's fun day is a whopping R50, 000 and Pillay said that once he achieves this, he will donate it to a brave individual, who is currently fighting the battle against cancer.

'All I require from cancer patients is a motivational letter, stating why they should receive the accumulated funds. In order for me to make the best decision, there will be an intensive screening process put in place once I receive all motivational letters. Medical reports would have to be provided and I would also like to meet with the patients' doctor if possible. This will not be done in a malicious way, but would rather help me make an informed decision. I would also prefer if the money was donated to a patient, who is suffering from a lack of financial stability and does not have enough funds to even pay for their treatment," he explained

Having lost his brother to cancer, Pillay knows all too well the financial expenses that come with the treatment and he said that Lucalis would have really wanted him to uplift the life of a cancer patient.

"He was a giving young man, who had a bright future ahead of him. It is sad that he was taken away from us at such a young age, however, if I can make a difference and help an individual, who is affected by cancer, then nothing more would make me happier. Anyone, regardless of race, age, gender or creed, can submit their motivational letter to me. If they are unable to, then a close relative can also write in on their behalf. At the end of the day, this is something that I need to do. Life is uncertain to all of us and we should therefore appreciate the time we have with our loved ones," added Pillay.

For those interested in submitting motivational letters, they are asked to do so between December 5 and

Suspects escape from Chatsworth **Magistrate's Court**

Two suspects, who were due to appear on charges of possession of unlicensed ammunition and rape, escaped from the Chatsworth Magistrates Court, on Tuesday.

Police have issued a warning for residents to be cautious against the escapees. Communications officer of the Chatsworth SAPS, Cpt Cheryl Pillay, said a docket of escaping from lawful custody is being investigated by members of the Chatsworth SAPS.

The prisoners are 22-years-old and 30-yearsold.

Commander of the Chatsworth SAPS Family Violence, Child Protection and Sexual OffencesUnit (FCS), Col Ellappen, said the rape suspect was arrested after a woman claimed she was selling clothes at the Khokhoba Informal Settlement in Bayview and was lured into a shack by the man.

"She alleges that when she went into the shack, he raped her. It is concerning that he escaped from the court especially since he is charged for a serious offence. We will do everything in our power to arrest him," said Col Ellappen.

Antenatal clinic proudly supports World Aids Day campaign

December 1 was a special occasion for the compassionate and dedicated staff of RK Khan Hospital's antenatal clinic as it not only marked World Aids Day but also the 10th anniversary of the Elimination of Mother to Child Transition (EMTCT) programme.

To highlight this, an information-packed and exciting programme was put together by the EMTCT coordinator and HIV and ARV practitioner, Sister Ragini Munsamy and her team.

As customary, the programme commenced with a special prayer by Rev A Pentiah, who asked all in attendance to remember those who have been affected by the dreaded disease. The programme also consisted of several addresses by staff of the clinic, who explained the importance of the EMTCT programme and how it has touched many lives since its inception.

In particular, Sister Ragini Munsamy said during

her address to her patients that it amazes her to know that the programme is now in its 10th year of existence.

existence. "When a few of us started working on the EMTCT programme 10 years ago, we knew that a lot of hard work, late hours and sacrifices would have to be made. Today, it is all worth it. The journey was not an easy one, but I am pleased to say that this programme has had a positive impact on many of our patients and has also prevented mother to child transmission." she explained.

transmission," she explained. She urged HIV positive expectant mothers to ensure that they receive antenatal services and testing during pregnancy and have access to antiretroviral treatment at the same time. "They also require the necessary medication and need to practice safe childbirth practises and correct infant feeding, among other aspects. Remember, test and treat! You will not regret it," she said.

Munsamy's love and dedication towards her HIV positive patients was definitely evident throughout her address as she pointed out that without them, her life would never be the same. "I love each and every one of my patients. As a sister in the nursing fraternity, it is so important to be compassionate towards your patients as you have to try to understand where they are coming from. One would think that being HIV positive has broken them, but I disagree. The strength that they display is commendable and I thank them for not giving up and also for putting the needs of their baby first," she added.

She concluded by extending her heartfelt thanks and appreciation to the Matron Pather of the antenatal

clinic as well as the nurses for their unwavering support, commitment and friendship over the years. The programme not only focussed on HIV/Aids, but also the importance of using protecting during sexual intercourse, the use of contraceptives and several other important aspects. To make the programme more exciting in between formalities, special and exciting song items were rendered by local artist, Joey Munsamy, who definitely kept the audience going with his energetic and vibrant personality. The highlight of the morning was indeed the traditional cutting of the cake ceremony.

Once formalities concluded, patients were lovingly provided with delightful goodie bags, nutritional



treats, sumptuous breyani and refreshments and of course, cake, to sweeten the memorable occasion even further. All generous sponsors, who went beyond the call of duty, were also acknowledged for their role in contributing towards the success of the programme.

Those who wish to get tested or need more information regarding the HIV/Aids pandemic are more than welcome to visit the friendly staff of the antenatal clinic, who are undoubtedly on a mission to diminish and destroy the various myths surrounding the virus and reinforce the fact that contracting the virus does not equal to a death sentence. Mall safety tips for families

The holiday season is a time of year when parents need to be extra vigilant. From hurried trips to the mall for food, entertainment and shopping, to crowded airports and bus terminals, the holidays are an enjoyable time for families but can be a very stressful and dangerous time for parents.

Communications officer of Malvern SAPS, W/O Radhika Marimuthu, said that it can be nerve-wracking to keep track of children irrespective of their ages or whether in crowds or groups.

She has advised the public to adhere to the following hints to make the festive season a safer and enjoyable one:

• Brief your children before going out.

• Remember to use the 'two giant steps' rule where your children must never be more than two giant steps away from you. Make it a fun and easy way for your children to remember not to drift away.

• Tell children that if they ever become separated from you, they should look for a 'safe stranger' for help. These include a mum with children, a person at a till, the security at the mall or a police officer in uniform. With older children, agree on a 'designated meeting area' in your planning, in case you become separated.

• Tell your children to never leave the mall or store to go looking for you, despite what anyone tells them. Always tell them that you would never leave until you are reunited at the mall and that you will always be looking for them.

• Parents are urged to dress their children in bright colours to make him easy to spot in a crowd.

• At airports, bus terminuses or shopping malls, parents can use a cute harness for toddlers who are prone to running off. This may seem over the top but your child's safety is of the utmost importance.

• Teach the children to always check first with you before going anywhere in a public place, mall, beach, play area, or even the restroom. • Parents should not treat public facilities as a babysitting zone. Do not under any circumstances leave your children alone at video arcades, movie theatres, play areas, or other public places. Predators look for unsupervised kids here.

· Always take young children into the restroom with you. Look for well-lit restrooms in areas of high traffic volumes in busy places. • If children go into a restroom alone. If you feel comfortable letting your older child (at least nine-years-old) use the men's room alone, stand outside the door and call in as your child enters, 'I'm right out here if you need me'. It's a sign to anyone who may be hanging around in there that there's a parent

close by. • If you think your child is taking too long, open the door and call in, 'Is everything okay?' If you don't get an answer or are unsure, enter the restroom immediately to be sure your child is safe.

• Children have been known to leave with a stranger because 'he seemed nice' or 'she didn't look like a stranger'. So always inform your children to never do this.

• Make sure that your child knows your cellphone number, address or that of a family member.

of the 16 Days of Activism campaign to end violence against women and children. A newspaper estimated that one in every four women is physically abused by her intimate partner. Every six hours, a woman is killed by her current or former intimate partner. Abuse can also be emotional, sexual and verbal. It is shocking to find that the same woman will continue to live with the abuser and endure more abuse. Love cannot be the reason for being together. Nobody abuses somebody they love, neither can the abused love somebody who continues to hurt her. Various reasons are advanced for enduring abuse. Alcohol and drugs make women vulnerable and helpless. An intoxicated man will have fewer inhibitions and easily resort to violence. Other reasons for accepting abuse may include low self-esteem, depression, guilt, fear, embarrassment and self-blame. A common reason is the financial dependence on men especially for women who are unemployed, are poor and have no education. It is worse for women who have no parents or siblings, or whose family members cannot afford to support them. The cycle of violence consists of three phases. The first phase is tension building from the abuser leading to an argument. The second is the explosion phase where the abuse occurs. It is at this phase that

actually report the abuse. The honeymoon phase then follows. He apologises and showers her with flowers, chocolates and gifts. She withdraws charges, returns home and lives in a false state of security until the first phase starts all over again. The violence will not end until the victim leaves or both seek counseling.

Typical characteristics of abusers consist of:

· Jealousy or insecurity. She has to account for her time and whereabouts. Some have to submit photographic evidence of their locations. Controlling behavior. Some women are locked inside their homes. Others cannot leave the house or use the car. Their partners retain their bank cards

· Isolation. Women are isolated from family and friends so that she cannot seek help.

· Forces his partner to have sex or engage in sexual activities against her will.

Hold strong gender justification for his role, "man of the house, king of the castle," or advances a religious reason for his behaviour.

If you are a victim or a perpetrator, it is time to stop the abuse. If you are a witness, don't look the other way. Report all incidents of abuse.

Create your own Christmas crackers

Try these amazing homemade Christmas crackers to give your Christmas dinner table a personal touch. These are so easy to make and will definitely add to the festive cheer. You will need:

Toilet-roll tubes, or thin postal tubes cut to size
 Attractive A4 paper (you can use newspaper, wrapping paper, comics, book pages, prints – whatever you have to hand and will look pretty)
 Sticky tape

Cracker snaps (you'll find them at online stores)
 Scissors

Thin card, at least 20cm long
Decorative string or ribbon

Place a toilet-roll tube on the long edge of the paper, in the centre, and hold it in place with some sticky tape. Thread a cracker snap through the toilet-roll and tape it down to one side of the paper. Roll the tube across the paper, then secure with three bits of tape along the seam, in the centre and ends. Cut two 20x5cm strips from the thin card. Curl each one into a circle and place one inside each end of the cracker, leaving roughly two cms sticking out of the end. Hold the card in place with a little sticky tape.

At one end of the cracker, form the hand signal for 'OK' around the gap between the toilet roll and the card. Gently squeeze and twist a little with your thumb and forefinger, while using your other hand to hold the card in shape. Keep squeezing until the cracker has a nicely defined neck to it. Tie a piece of string or ribbon around the neck of the cracker. Cut off any straggly bits or make a bow.

Pop a Christmas hat, a cooking tip or joke and a little surprise in the open end of the cracker. Seal the open end as before.

A 'Santa-rific' brownie recipe

125g butter, chopped 1 1/3 cups (200g) dark choc melted, plus 1/2 cup (75g) extra 1/2 cup (110g) caster sugar 2 eggs, lightly beaten 2 cups (300g) plain flour 3/4 cup (140g) chocolate chips 16 strawberries, hulled and trimmed 1/2 cup (125ml) thickened cream, whipped Method

Preheat oven to 180C. Grease and line base and sides of a 19 cm square cake pan. Com-

bine butter, chocolate and sugar in large microwave safe bowl, microwave uncovered on medium for one minute and stir. Repeat process in 30 second intervals until melted and smooth, cool two to five minutes. Stir in eggs, flour and chocolate chips. Spoon mixture into prepared pan, smooth top. Bake 25 minutes, or until mixture is just firm to touch. Cool in pan. Turn out and use a four cm round cutter to cut 16 rounds. Mitsubishi reveals 2018 SA bound Eclipse Cross pricing Down Under

eading for South Africa next year, Mitsubishi Australia has released pricing details for the new Eclipse Cross, hinting at what local buyers could expect.

Reviving a name last used in 2011 on the Galantbased sports coupe, the new compact crossover will go on sale Down Under on December 22nd, surprisingly only with a petrol engine and three model line-up.

As previously reported, petrol power for the Eclipse comes from a 1.5-litre turbocharged mill, which in Aussie spec develops 110 kW and 250 Nm of torque. For other markets, the four-pot cranks out 120 kW with torque remaining unchanged. A new eight-step CVT is the only transmission available with a choice of front or all-wheel drive.

The only other option, a 2.2-litre DI-D turbodiesel punching out 110 kW and 400 Nm linked to either a six-speed manual or eight-speed automatic gearbox, has been ruled out with Mitsubishi citing

Audi RS3 Sedan is performance bliss

There are one or two cars that arrive at the Autodealer office each year that I would genuinely consider buying, if I could afford them in an ideal world that is. One such car is the Audi RS3 Sedan, which become a "love at first drive "affair" after a few hundred metres.

Does it look special enough?

There has always been a bit of debate surrounding certain performance Audi models and their tendency to err on the conservative side when it comes to their design. I feel that the RS3, in sedan

form, strikes the perfect balance between aggression and sophistication. There are massive air inlets on the front bumper, a large quattro badge on the lower bumper and at the rear, and two enormous exhaust tips on either side.

The great news for those who disagree with me and want a sportier look, is that Audi Sport will be offering its Performance Parts catalogue as optional extras within the local market. The best news of all is that many of these items such as the wheels, wings, stickers, exhausts and splitters are available for retro-fitment on existing Audi Sport models.

Driving RS3

At the time of driving the sedan version of the RS3, the updated Sportback hadn't been launched locally as of yet. Therefore, this was my first taste of the heavily revised five-cylinder turbocharged motor.

Aside from cutting an incredible 26kg from the previous unit, Audi has also made it more efficient and more importantly, more powerful. There's now 294kW/480Nm on offer, transmitted through a seven-speed S tronic gearbox to all four wheels via the obligatory quattro all-wheel drive system.

The result, with launch control activated, is an unexpected, addictive and astonishing lurch forward, which gets you to 100km/h from zero in well under four seconds, despite Audi claiming 4.1 seconds. It's not just the 0-100km/h time that's impressive though, it's the elasticity of the motor, which allows for really fast in-gear acceleration, making the RS3 fast pretty much everywhere.

In an era of rather generic turbocharged fourcylinder performance cars, the RS3's five-pot produces the sort of soundtrack that makes the driver and occupants look like human Howler Monkeys as they drive, mouths gaping in enjoyment.

There aren't many cars that I drive for the sake of



driving, but with the RS3, I found any excuse to take it out for a drive. I suppose that the appeal for me is in the fact that in terms of performance, this A3-based sedan will sit with machinery considered supercars as little as five years ago.

It's still an Audi

Another aspect of the RS3 that is a massive plus for potential owners, is that this is still an A3 underneath its aggressive body kit and big alloy wheels. The benefit of that is the impressive MQB platform and superb quality of the interior, meaning there's a capable everyday car beneath all the performance regalia.

As with the regular A3 Sedan, rear headroom is not ideal for taller occupants and the boost isn't massive at 310-litres, but being a sedan with four doors, it is still relatively practical. Being a performance car, not too many people care about its consumption, but it's nice to know that it's not excessive. I managed just over 10-litres/100km dur-

ing my four day stint with the car, which is still quite far from the 8.3-litres/100km claim.

My test unit did have close to R100 000 worth of optional extras fitted, which is also typical Audi and pretty much any premium automaker these days. Some of the options included the MMI Navigation infotainment system, the Virtual Cockpit Display, Bang and Olufsen sound system, panoramic roof, carbon fibre interior trim, adaptive cruise control, S sports seats, red brake calipers and the gloss black styling package.

Verdict

Factoring in the optional extras means that my test unit was over R1-million, for an A3-based car. That being said, the level of refinement, comfort and performance on offer rivals many cars that cost many hundreds of thousands of Rands more. The RS3 isn't cheap, but as a package, it's difficult to beat.

Nissan (finally) confirms all-new Micra for "early 2018" launch

issan has confirmed that its long awaited fifth generation Micra will make its official unveiling in early 2018, with the final date yet to be announced.

Shown at the Paris Motor Show last year and inspired by the Sway concept that debuted in Geneva in 2015, the new K14 Micra rides on the same platform as the current Renault Clio, and will supplement the existing K13 model now known as the Micra Active.

International models come equipped with a seveninch touchscreen display, Bose sound system and a full suite of driver assistance system consisting of Lane Departure Warning and Prevention, 360 degree camera system, Traffic Sign Recognition, High Beam Assist and Blind Spot Warning, as well as Intelligent Braking with Pedestrian Detection. Motivation comes from the same range of engines powering the Clio, namely the familiar 66 kW 898 cc turbocharged three-cylinder, a 55 kW normally aspirated 1.0-litre triple and a 1.5-litre dCi turbodiesel punching out 66 kW. A five-speed manual gearbox is standard fare across the range.

While exterior changes to the Coupe are subtle with mostly new alloy wheel designs, Coupe badging on the C-pillar and an assortment of colours, the new Roadster features an

As before, a sixspeed Steptronic gearbox sends the three-pot's power to wheels. the rear while the electric motors' grunt in send to the front wheels

via a two-speed automatic 'box, in effect resulting in the i8 being all-wheel drive. Unlike its exterior, changes to the interior include new seats, updated trim pieces, the Professional Navigation sys-



tem displayed on a 8.8-inch screen and model specific Heads-Up Display. Sales are due to commence in May next year with BMW South Africa yet to confirm final pricing and the exact launch date.

SA students at greater risk of depression and anxiety

Apart from exam stress and the pressure to perform and fit in, SA students also face a barrage of socio-economic challenges such as potential rape, victimisation and destructive protests on campus that could make them more vulnerable to anxiety and depression. The recent violent protests that again erupted at the University of Cape Town (UCT) and the Cape Peninsula University of Technology (CPUT) is a case in point. Several students were arrested for violent protests at UCT and angry students torched lecture rooms, which saw classes being suspended at CPUT. Similar protests seem to have become the norm at tertiary institutions across the country with fears of riots intensifying again in the lead up to this year's final exams. A 2015 study that was conducted revealed that among 1, 337 students of varying backgrounds found that as many as 12 percent of university students experienced moderate to severe symptoms of depression and 15 percent reported moderate to severe symptoms of anxiety. Shouqat Mug-jenker, a mental health portfolio manager pointed out that nearly a quarter (24.5 percent) of students who participated in the survey reported some form of suicidal ideation two weeks prior to being interviewed. "This is higher than the 9.1 percent prevalence that is reported for the general South African population and higher than the 6.3 percent and 11.4 percent prevalence reported among college students in the US and Turkey respectively," he explained. Suicidal ideation is when a person has thoughts about killing him or herself, but does not include the final act of following through on these thoughts. Being a student involves a lot of change and uncertainty as they transition from

adolescence to adulthood. "The added stress to perform in a highly demanding environment, whilst developing a capacity for intimate relationships and trying to establish their own identity, often makes them more prone to developing depressive tendencies. Some SA students also fear for their own personal safety on campus, which could further exacerbate matters and make them more anxious often a pre-cursor for depression,' he remarked. Mugjenker added that students also have to deal with all of these challenges before their brain is fully mature since the prefrontal cortex – the part of the brain that helps you to reason and control impulses is only fully developed by the age of 25. "As a result, teenagers and young adults process information differently since they use the amygdala – the emotional part of the brain to analyse information. That's why you will find that younger people are less risk averse and give in to peer-pressure more so than older adults. Their reward-seeking tendencies however

could also lead them to experiment with pleasure-inducing substances like drugs and alcohol, which could lead to a dependence and depression over time," he stated. Mugjenker said even though it may be difficult to pinpoint depression in someone, there are some tell-tale signs to look out for in young adults. These include: A loss of interest in activities that they used to enjoy

• Being less sociable, withdrawing from their peers and spending more time alone

· Lack of energy, increased fatigue · Poor concentration and inattentiveness while in class or social situations

· Erosion of self-esteem and increased feelings of hopelessness • Finding it difficult to fall asleep or

waking up often during the early hours of the morning Overindulging in alcohol as a pos-

sible escape or to numb the pain of loneliness

•Low sex drive •Significant weight-loss or weight

•Suicidal thoughts or attempts In South Africa, accessing mental healthcare remains problematic and even though most academic institutions provide professional student counselling services, these are often overprescribed. Consequently, students are unable to access even minimally adequate care to support their mental well-being. Students who suffer from ill mental health and don't receive the required treatment are also at greater risk of academic failure and are more likely to drop out of university. Interventions at universities and other tertiary institutions still predominantly rely on traditional approaches to

psychotherapy, such as one-on-one counselling which most students can't afford and may also not be suitable for all students. In the absence of sufficient accessible and affordable public mental healthcare in SA and tertiary institutions, Pharma Dvnamics has developed an e-intervention, called Let's Talk, which aims to support students with mental health concerns. The portal encourages individuals to open up and share their struggles and advice regarding mental illness in a safe space, where trained psychiatrists offer support and encourage sufferers to take an active step in their own recovery via psychotherapy in the form of videos and webinars; advice about medication and alternative therapy options; educational literature and nutrition. Mugjenker said the Let's Talk platform aims to address the barriers which prevent students from accessing needed psychological care and could help young adults to identify risk factors in themselves and fellow students before their illness reaches a debilitating stage.

'BugWise' app launched to curb antibiotic resistance

Antibiotic resistance (ABR) has increased worldwide, largely because of the overuse and misuse of antibiotic medications, but if left unchecked, experts fear it could claim up to 10 million lives per annum at a cumulative cost of USD100 trillion by 2050. The threat of antibiotic resistant superbugs is becoming increasingly common in South Africa too and it is estimated that up to 80 percent of all antibiotic scripts in the country are predominantly for acute respiratory tract infections like sinusitis, bronchitis and pharyngitis. These infections are mostly of viral origin and shouldn't be treated with an antibiotic. It is estimated that 60 percent of these antibiotic prescriptions are inappropriate. Misuse of antibiotics has resulted in multidrug-resistant (MDR), extensively drug-resistant (XDR) and pan-drug-resistant (PDR) bacteria, which are being reported more often in South Africa and the threat of this potentially becoming our worst nightmare was already highlighted in a 2008 publication in the South African Medical Journal (SAMJ). According to Annemarie Blackmore,

the window of opportunity to control ABR is rapidly closing, hence the urgency to launch inter-

ventions that will reduce excessive antibiotic prescribing. One such intervention is the new Bug-Wise app developed by Pharma Dynamics to support Antibiotic Stewardship programmes. The BugWise app aims to reduce the emergence of resistant bacteria, caused by inappropriate use of antibiotics, by making relevant and updated information readily available. Blackmore described BugWise as a one-stop-app for doctors and patients alike. "The app has been designed with the busy physician in mind and will help healthcare practitioners in private and public healthcare settings to optimise treatment while minimising antibiotic resistance. For example, doctors can input a patient's information, such as diagnosis and chronic medications that they're on, directly into the app and receive treatment recommendations specific to that individual. The app also allows doctors access to ABR surveillance data, which keeps them up to date on resistant strains that are prevalent in the area,"she said, Patients on the other hand will be able to research information on their diagnosis, along with the medication they have been prescribed. The app will inform them about antibiotics and the dangers associated with incorrect use, as well as some useful tips on how to prevent infections. They are also able to set reminders to take their medication at the correct times. Blackmore further highlighted that health topics, such as ABR, tend to be ineffectively communicated to the public. "Since most people have access to smartphones these days, we see huge value in the use of alternative and sustainable education resources such as Bug-Wise. Educating the public is an extremely important factor in tackling ABR, as often patients put pressure on doctors to prescribe antibiotics and may not understand that often their illness is likely caused by a virus which cannot be treated with an antibiotic," she added. Key features of the app include general alerts around updated drug monographs, access to the latest medical and scientific publications and articles related to ABR, detailed microbe and medication information, drug interaction checker, antibiotic duplication checker, dosing calculators; and importantly, surveillance data. The BugWise app can be accessed via both android and iOS phones, and be downloaded from any app store. Blackmore said the reasons driving excessive prescription of antibiotics are multifactorial, but perhaps most importantly, is the overlapping clinical features of viral and bacterial infections making it difficult for GPs to distinguish between patients that would benefit from an antibiotic and who wouldn't.]Professor Guy Richards, a specialist said the BugWise can help doctors to optimise patient outcomes while minimising antibiotic resistance at the click of a button. "We're very excited about the app, specifically because it can be customised to include statistics for specific locations to incorporate local sensitivity patterns. BugWise makes this kind of information available to doctors in a much more efficient and accessible manner, which is ideal for busy doctors who have limited time," he added.
