

A Queensburgh teenager is lucky to be alive after he survived a brutal attack by his peers outside school, last week.

According to Bhai Singh, his son, who is a grade 12 pupil at Wingen Heights Secondary School, was targeted after he was allegedly bullied and robbed for his belongings at school.

"My son told me that there was a tug-of-war competition held at school so the pupils left their bags in the change room. After the event, my son went to the change room together with other pupils and found that their bags were tampered with. His money was stolen," the father explained.

Singh further stated that other pupils cellphones and other valuable items were also stolen.

"They enquired with other pupils, who said they saw a pupil who went into the change room. My son and his friend reported the incident to the principal, who called all involved and resolved the issue. All pupils left after the issue was resolved," said Singh.

Unknowing that the pupil, who had been reported for the theft of the items, was 'grudging' him, the teenager made his way out of the school gate and was called by the accused.

"He screamed my name and said 'here is your cellphone'. When I turned, the pupil stabbed me three times with a tin-opener," said the

The pupil received over 20 stitches near his ear and is recovering from the trauma of the

youngster, who is still recovering from the incident.

The boy was stabbed near his ears.

"Thankfully, the perpetrator missed his jugular veins or he would have bled to death. A parent, who intervened, grabbed the accused and he stopped swiping the weapon at my son. If not, he would have killed my son. The same pupil allegedly threatened another pupil in his class with a knife, a week ago, telling him that he is going to kill him," Singh claimed.

he is going to kill him," Singh claimed. The father added, "We feel that the boy is a danger to pupils at the school. We hope that parents and staff at the school take a more active role in these children so that their behaviour improves and our children are safe at school."

Principal of the school, Mr JS Govender, said security guards are employed to protect pupils within the parameters of the school and even though the incident occurred outside the school premises, a disciplinary hearing was held

"The incident was reported to the police. At school level, a disciplinary hearing was held and the pupils were sanctioned to be involved in community service. They are also receiving anger management counselling and social development to pment counselling," said Govender.



According to Krupanandham, cabin crew training consisted of extensive seven weeks of inhouse Emirates training which included medical




training, fire-fighting, advanced restraint techniques, safety and emergency equipment procedures, image and uniform training, service training, customer relationship management and evacuation drills.

Moorton family 'forced' out of their home by angry mob

A Mortoon family was allegedly forced out of their home, after a mob of about 300 armed invaders, stormed into their property and assaulted residents, on Tuesday night.

After several hours, the family managed to escape the horrific ordeal with the clothes on their backs

Speaking on behalf of her traumatised family, Raessa Bibi Peerbhay (47) said that she has been renting the house from a woman, who claimed to be the owner, since last September, together with her two sons and her husband, Mohamed Rafick Peerbhay.

"What happened to my family is an act of injustice and cruelty. I would never want anyone to go through this. The angry mob was armed with sticks, boulders, slashes and iron pipes. This should not be accepted in any community. I hope and pray that everyone, who threatened our family, is dealt with accordingly. I feel like the neighbourhood turned their backs on my family. However, I thank those who did come to our aid. I believe that we would have been killed if we did not flee," she said. Members of the family sustained various injuries.

Mrs Peerbhay claimed that an arrangement was made between her and a woman, who was believed to be the owner of the property.

"The supposed owner of the property was leading the mob. She signed an affidavit that if we paid an amount of money to her, the property would become ours. To-

gether with our mosque, we managed to get the money together and pay her. She failed to release the title deed to the house. After requesting a utility bill and further investigations, we realised that the owner of the property has been dead since 1994. I did not try to steal this woman's house. My family and I were victims of fraud."

Meanwhile, chairman of the Moorton Community Policing Forum, Zain Suliman said, "The incident at Lusaka was a dispute between landlord and tenant. It's a complicated story as to who owns the property. The owner went to collect her rental which amounts to over R4,000 and was assaulted by the tenants and that is when things got out of hand. There were threats made, however, the Moorton CPF crew managed to negotiate and bring calm to the situation. We've established an understanding with key residents at Lusaka and a working relationship via the Moorton CPF. To our Moorton CPF crew, Crossmoor and all parties who were ready to provide assistance, may God bless us all." Corporate communications officer of the eThekwini Inner South cluster, Cpt Cheryl Pillay said on Tuesday, May 8, 2018 at about 6pm, an altercation occurred between a landlord and tenant at Rainbow Crescent in Moorton. Chatsworth SAPS is investigating a case of common assault and malicious damage to property.

Days before the country could celebrates Mother's Day, a Northdene mother was found brutally killed in her home on Schooldale Road. Sixty-two-year-old Dolly Sinthamoney was found lying in a pool of blood in the lounge of her home with multiple stab wounds to her face.

Explaining the details of how he found his mother-in-law lying in a pool of blood with multiple stab wounds to her face, Jody Naicker said it was about 3:15pm when he went to his mother-in-law's house to drop off some food for her.

"I noticed that the door and gate were unlocked and felt that strange as she was always very careful and kept everything locked. I proceeded to enter the house and called out her name but there was no answer. There was a blood trail from the kitchen and I followed the blood spatter to the bedroom and then to the lounge. I found her lying on the floor in the lounge. The house was ransacked," he said.

Sinthamoney was described by her family as a friendly and loving person, who lived for her two daughters, her husband and her grandchildren. Naicker said he hoped that the people responsible for her death are apprehended soon.

Communications officer of Malvern SAPS, W/O Radhika Marimuthu, said investigations revealed that there was no forced entry at the premises. "The house was ransacked and household items, as well as items of a personal nature, were taken. The scene is being processed by all relevant role-players," she added. A case of house robbery and

murder has been registered and is being investigated at the Malvern SAPS. Anyone with information can call the Malvern SAPS detectives on 031 489-9624, 031 489-9629 or Crime Stop on 08600-10111.

"Senior citizens living alone are cautioned against letting people onto the property. If work has to be done on the property, rather let this be done on days when family members are around," added W/O Marimuthu. Station commander of Malvern SAPS, Lt Col Valarine Reddy, reiterated that seniors must be wary of who they allow on the property and visits should be done when family is

Alleged Bayview serial rapist remanded in police custody

The 39-year-old man, who was arrested and appeared in the Chatsworth Magistrate's Court on five counts of rape, was remanded into police custody, last week. The accused will reappear at the Chatsworth Magistrate's Court on May 15, for a formal bail application. According to reports by the eThekwini Inner South Cluster FCS investigators, five girls aged between eight and 12years-old were allegedly raped by the suspect, who resides at eManyaleni Informal Settlement in Bayview. The victims, who also reside at the informal settlement, informed police that the rapes occurred from 2017. An angry mob of residents gathered outside court and protested against the release of the man, last week. After the case was heard, the mob toy-toyed outside his

shack and demanded that his family vacate the premises. Bayview SAPS and Public Order Policing were at the scene and on high alert while relatives of the man removed belongings and vehicle from the settlement. Acting cluster commander of eThekwini Inner South, Brig Coenraad Marais, assured the community that investigators will work around the clock to ensure that perpetrators of such cruel acts against helpless children are dealt with within the prescripts of law. "The police will ensure that stakeholders will offer support and counselling to the victims. Police are appealing to parents to know the whereabouts of their children and to sensitise them to walk in company. Do not talk to strangers neither accept lifts or gifts from them," he added.

I am a Muslim theologian responsible for a local mosque in Chatsworth, who is actively involved in community work for more than a decade. There are about 180 pupils between the ages of four and 16 who receive education at our mosque daily. About 10 years ago, we had made an application to council to install speed humps on the busy road outside our mosque. This was after the number of accidents that occurred on this road, right on our doorstep. Lives were lost. Cars were damaged. Boundary walls were destroyed. Our application went to the highest office of council. We still have everything on record. The local ward councillors were contacted. They came, we sat and discussed the matter. Political parties including the DA, ANC and MF were all involved. Our correspondences even reached the chief whip of the ANC as well as the mayor of Durban. We were sent from pillar to post. The process went on and on for almost a year. Very bluntly, till today, all we achieved was zero. And while speed humps were being installed on Link Road because of a single tragedy a week ago, exactly the same time, we had three more accidents on our very same road. Why must legal measures be taken against us to the benefit of illegal dwellers? Such action is undoubtedly an obvious invitation to a host of criminal elements. The public should be made aware of the reasons that actually call for speed humps. It is insufficient to say that relevant authorities have taken everything into account and eventually decided for it. We, the public, have a right to know exactly what motivates such poor action.

Instructors and coaches urged to register with Swimming SA

Teaching children to swim is a high-risk profession, both from the athlete and the teacher's point of view. All schools, swimming instructors, swim coaches, swim school owners, parents and clubs are urged to employ professionally qualified instructors and coaches, who have been trained and vetted by Swimming South Africa. Swimming instructors and coaches need to register with Swimming South Africa via the district or provincial federation. Instructors and coaches also need to keep their coaching and first aid/ CPR qualifications updated as well as to ensure that their police clearances are still valid. The registration requirements are a requirement in terms of the Children's Act (as amended March 2015) as well the latest regulations being promulgated under national the Sports and Recreation Act, 1998. This act is primarily promulgated to protect children's rights and affects all persons who are working with children.

Swimming instructors and coaches are required to follow the process below:

All schools and clubs need to ensure that the employees are accredited by Swimming SA, also that they are not included on the sexual offenders register by ensuring that all their instructors/coaches have the required police clearance. No person managing a facility, school or club may allow a person whose name appears in the sexual offenders register to work with or have access to children at the facility.

Registration of swimmers:

Schools and clubs are requested to register children they are teaching/ coaching with KZN Aquatics. This will be done at no charge to the school or club. KZN Aquatics will supply the schools with registration forms that will require basic information only.







Health MEC urges nurses to go back to basics

With International Nurses Day being commemorated on May 12, provincial Health MEC Dr Sibongiseni Dhlomo thanked all the hard working nurses in the province, and urged them to go back to basics in the provision of healthcare. The inner voice

The lack of reading by most youngsters is a real cause for alarm. Apart from gaining knowledge and exemplars of others, it is such a good way of spending one's leisure time. Reading is a recreational need of any individual and it encourages the sound use of leisure time. Programmes for reading should start at school so that it permeates to the home. Monitoring of reading is essential. Some pupils do not even read their set works and are dependent on study aids. This needs to stop. In the 60s, 70s and 80s, schools that produced excellent academic matric results such as Chatsworth Secondary, Glenover Secondary, Shallcross Secondary and a few others had principals' who placed great emphasis on reading. These were not well-resourced schools but the initiative to drive the reading programme by teachers led to community leaders driving the campaign to get the Durban City Council to build municipal libraries. There were lively debating teams and elocution contests which brought out the innate talents of pupils. This is sadly lacking at the present moment of time. Chatsworth has five fully-fledged municipal libraries complemented by libraries at local schools. The first municipal library was opened at Montford in June 1971. This was seven years after displaced people occupied their houses in the mass Chatsworth Housing Scheme. Subsequently Woodhurst, Moorton, Bayview and Croftdene libraries were opened by the municipality. Community leaders made strong representations to the municipality to develop these facilities which are stocked with modern books and facilities. When these libraries were opened, a special appeal was made to children to make use of the library, as books opened up a veritable wonderland to a child and there is joy in books for all of them. When these libraries were established, it was hoped that extensive use of it would be made by all the residents because

a public library is a real centre of culture, propagating human knowledge and dispensing delight. Initially this was the case but this is not presently the pattern. With the advent of technology, devices such as cellphones, iPads and others have become the play instruments of young minds. Recording videos and taking pictures on cellphones of various happenings and playing games seem to be the growing trend among pupils and is now being used as a way of entertainment. This creates problems as many youngsters begin to communicate in SMS language and this translates into the classroom. This is borne out in the essay writing, creative writing texts. Some pupils efforts are riddled with grammatical errors and devoid of current happenings knowledge. This is due to a lack of reading. Surveys conducted indicate that pupils do not read local daily or weekend newspapers. In a recent study on literacy levels in 50 countries, which surveyed the reading ability among school children, South Africa finished last. It was also found that that out of every 10 pupils in South African schools, eight of them failed to read with meaning at grade four level. This is a cause for concern. Therefore the thoughts of many commentators that the culmination of 12 years of schooling with the matric exams is indeed a milestone in a young person's life, and deserves to be noted as such, but the reality is that passing Matric in South Africa today is not necessarily a ticket to success in the tertiary field or beyond. What we need to produce are tickets which guarantees literacy through reading which are on par with equivalent countries elsewhere, and it was hoped that extensive use of it would be made by all the residents because a public library is a real centre of culture, propagating human knowledge and dispensing delight. Initially this was the case but this is not presently the pattern.



Audi RS3 Sportback: The super hatch

he hot hatch segment has evolved at a rather rapid rate over the past decade or so. It all started with iconic vehicles such as the Peugeot 205 GTI and Volkswagen's Golf GTI in the 70s and 80s. These cars gained notoriety because they were based upon regular everyday hatchbacks, but had rather large engines, improved brakes and suspension upgrades. These, therefore, provided the average person with a practical and indeed, an attainable way of accessing driving fun.

The formula has stayed very much the same over the past four decades or so, however, recently we have seen hot hatchbacks broken-up into sub-segments. These include mildly tuned 'warm hatchbacks' such as the Renault Clio GT-Line, to hot hatchbacks such as the Golf GTI and then superhot hatchbacks, such as the Audi RS3 which I sampled recently.

Why super-hot hatch?

Hot hatchbacks, traditionally have been fast cars, but the super-hot hatch segment, which includes the likes of the BMW M140i, Mercedes-AMG A45 and of course, the RS3 Sportback have really taken what we thought a basic hatchback was capable of and rewritten the rulebook. You see, the relatively unassuming Audi provides the sort of performance one might have expected from some sport and supercars of yesteryear.

Performance

Under the hood of the A3-based RS3 we find a very heavily revised version of the brand's 2.5litre five-cylinder turbo petrol motor which, among other things, now features an aluminium crankcase to reduce the engine's weight by a hefty 26 kg while also increasing its power output. The RS3 churns out 294kW/480Nm which is transmitted through a seven-speed S tronic dualclutch gearbox and a quattro all-wheel drive sys-

These figures translate into a 0-100km/h time of 4.0 seconds, as tested up in Gauteng by one of our colleagues with his VBox Performance Meter. The savagery doesn't stop after 100 km/h though, as the RS3 also manages a quarter mile time of

around 12.3 seconds. These figures are deeply impressive for a car that can be purchased at any Audi dealership and comes with a full maintenance plan, and even has room for your dog.

The engine and gearbox are the most dominating aspects of the RS3. The off-beat thrum of the 80sinspired rally soundtrack emitted from the 1-2-4-5-3 firing order of the 5-pot in combination with the standard sports exhaust make the Sportback and indeed, its sedan and TTRS siblings one of the most distinctive and intoxicating automotive soundtracks available.

Hot hatch dynamics

For those looking for the sharpest driving tool around, look elsewhere. The likes of the new Honda Civic Type R and even Ford's Focus RS are far more hardcore in their dynamic abilities versus the RS3. That is not to say that the Audi is a blunt tool, it goes about its business in a more refined, predictable and docile manner. There's still understeer when approaching the limit, but it's far less pronounced than in previous models.

Audi goodness

In traditional Audi fashion, the RS3 is restrained but has enough in the way of sporty touches to make the car appear slightly more special than an S3, from an aesthetic perspective. It doesn't scream about its performance credentials, which is either a good or a bad thing, depending on what you're after from your performance hatchback.

Being based upon the already capable A3, the RS3 is endowed with all of the virtues associated with Audi's premium hatchback. Expect the same interior with superb ergonomics, a tangible material quality that is class-leading and a general usability that means the RS3 can easily be put to the daily grind.

Verdict

While the Audi goodness is certainly present, the foibles of the brand are certainly present, with a lengthy list of optional extras that could easily see you paying over R1-million for a hatchback. That being said, the performance on offer in combination with relative practicality makes the RS3 a compelling package.

VW's Arteon makes concept a reality

he Volkswagen brand has launched a few seminal products so far this year which include the all-new Polo, Polo Vivo, the Tiguan AllSpace and most recently, its new GT car, the Arteon. First shown back in 2015 as the Sport Coupe Concept GTE, the Arteon has reached local shores and I had a chance to drive two derivatives in Johannesburg recently.

What is Arteon?

In very basic terms, the Arteon is a successor to the Passat-based CC model from a few years back in that it is a highly stylised four-door saloon car that places an emphasis on a sporty appearance and features engines, a platform and interior bits from other products within the Volkswagen portfolio.

Those looks

There are very few concept cars that get to see production without being heavily revised. The Arteon, although toned down slightly, certainly resembles the aforementioned 2015 Sport Coupe Concept GTE. This is a very good thing indeed, up front there's a clamshell bonnet, the new face VW which incorporates sharp, compact LED headlamps which integrate brilliantly with the horizontal lines of the front grille and large lower air intakes.

In side profile, the strong shoulder line, pillar-less doors and coupe-esque roofline do a good job of disguising the fact that this is one of the longest cars to make use of the brand's superb MQB platform. The rear-end features wraparound LED taillamps and a chunky rear bumper which houses the well-integrated exhaust exits on either side.

The need for R-Line

Overall, The Arteon is a great thing to behold but must be finished in the correct hue and equipped with the R-Line package to best show express those design details. The R-Line pack makes up two of the three models within the range, with the base model Elegance variant kicking things off.

The top-spec R-Line TDI and TSI models get 19-inch alloy wheels (optional 20-inch), sportier bumpers, a black bootlid spoiler, chrome-tipped exhaust exits, a chrome strip across the lower bodywork and gloss black C-signature front air intakes.

Interior familiarity

Stepping inside the Arteon, one is greeted by a familiar sight, with the same switchgear, steering wheel design and infotainment/instrument cluster options as the likes of the Tiguan, Golf and Passat. There is a central air vent which spans the length of the dashboard,



but overall, it's a very familiar place to be. This isn't necessarily a bad thing, as the Arteon displays all of the characteristics that make current VW interiors ergonomically impressive.

At launch we only had the option of driving the two top-spec R-Line models which come as standard with the 9.2-inch touchscreen infotainment system with Apple CarPlay, gesture control, Bluetooth connectivity, sat nav and App compatibility, a leather-wrapped sport multi-function steering wheel, heated Nappa leather seats with R-Line logo, aluminium pedals and black roof liner.

Powertrains

The engine line-up consists of two powertrains, a front-wheel drive 2.0-litre turbo diesel with 130kW/350Nm and a six-speed DSG gearbox which is good for a claimed consumption figure of 5.6-litres/100km. The range-topping variant gets the same powertrain as the popular Golf R model, albeit with slightly less power and torque. The 2.0 TSI variant gets the 4Motion all-wheel drive system, 206kW/350Nm and the superb seven-speed DSG gearbox. This means that this rather large machine will get from 0-100km/h in 5.6 seconds and on to a top speed of 250km/h.

Driving Arteon

As with all cars that use the MQB platform, the Arteon impresses in most areas. It provides a relatively supple ride quality, is comfortable, refined and excellent in day-to-day driving situations as I found on the congested streets of Johannesburg. When presented with the opportunity to drive both the petrol and diesel models at Zwartkops Raceway, I found both to out of their element, which is to be expected. Despite this, both acquitted themselves respectably and provided predictable, if slightly numb dynamic driving experiences. But, assessing these cars on track is a tad pointless as they are best on the open road, munching kilometre after kilometre.

The Arteon is a really impressive product that undercuts key rivals such as the upcoming Audi A5 Sportback and current BMW 4-series Gran Coupe in terms of pricing and specification while offering a slightly bigger package. It is, however, in a segment that is slowly declining into obscurity while its key rivals have the badge credentials to lure buyers, while the Arteon is still an unknown entity.

Service and warranty

The Arteon range comes standard with a five-year/90 000km Maintenance Plan and a three-year/120 000km warranty.

Isuzu KB still has what it takes

hen one departs the scene, another flourishes is probably the best way to describe Isuzu's recent success since General Motors (GM) left South Africa last year.

Old but setting records

In sharp contrast to struggling long-time stablemate, Opel, sales of Isuzu's aged KB has gone from strength to strength with a best of 1 499 units being sold in November last year.

While still far behind those of the Ford Ranger and Toyota Hilux, the KB's continuing popularity despite its advancing age and lack of some modern features has only ignited the debate further as to whether a double cab pick-up should, in fact, feel like an SUV with an open load bed.

Although Isuzu Motors South Africa is set to add the seven-seat MU-X to the local line-up, the KB is unlikely to fall out of favour with South Africans anytime soon, which only came to a fore again when the top-spec 300 D-TEQ LX 4x4 arrived for a weeklong stay.

Subtly aggressive

In a segment where looks have become a major talking point ever since the current Ranger debuted, Isuzu has opted to take the understated route where another in a series of updates in 2016 saw the KB receiving a new bonnet, projectorype headlights with integrated daytime running LEDs, a redesigned grille, restyled fog lamps and in the case of the LX, 18-inch alloy wheels, roof rails, chrome sports bar and a tow bar.

Despite not having the macho stance of its rivals, the KB has aged rather well in spite of is extensive cosmetic work, with a certain amount of aggression combined with a silhouette that is arguably more love than hate.

Dated, cheap interior

The exterior is, however, a big step up from the interior where the KB is all but outclassed in terms of quality and fit-and-finish. Granted, while the plastics used contribute to its workman-like characteristics, they are beyond cheap feeling and nowhere close to those of the Ford and Toyota,



never mind the Volkswagen Amarok

Added back in 2016, the 6.5-inch touchscreen infotainment system came as a welcome addition in place of the old dot-matrix sound system, but it looks decidedly aftermarket with graphics and icons akin to that of an early iMac.

In its defence, the system is easy to use and comes with satellite navigation, Bluetooth, Wi-Fi and a DVD player, as well as doubling up for the reverse camera display. It also gets two USB ports and an iPod socket below the Chevrolet TrailBlazer-derived rotary climate control dial. What counts in the dated cabin's favour though is space, not only in the front but also in terms of

storage areas and indeed impressive levels of rear passenger head and legroom.

Spacious and reasonably well specified.

Standard equipment is adequate and includes electric windows all around, cruise control, a four-speaker sound system, push-button start, rear parking sensors and keyless, although safety is down compared to the Ranger and Amarok with ABS and EBD, BAS, two airbags, traction control and Hill Start Assist being highlights.

Unstressed but raucous truck engine

An area where the KB shows its age the most though is underneath the bonnet. Essentially the

same 4JJ1-TCX oil burner that has its roots in the N-series truck, the 3.0-litre D-TEQ mill has remained virtually untouched since introduction and produces 130kW/380Nm.

While updated in Australia last year where it cranks out 430Nm, the motor sounds agricultural and is saddled with a bit of turbo-lag, with the level of noise on the move not being helped by a rather old-fashioned, long-through manual gearbox that only has five gears, and which requires a firm hand to swap cogs.

It is, however, a trait that has been diminishing in many top-spec pick-ups of late, with the clutch being light and ideally suited to the KB's workhorse roots instead of the optional five-speed automatic.

On the road

Although the rotary four-wheel drive dial was left in 2H for most of the KB's stay, previous encounters off the beaten track have shown it to be a formidable contender no matter the terrain. Fuel consumption in mixed driving conditions toppedout at 10.0-litres/100km, although after nearly 500km, the trip computer still indicated a remaining range of 380km.

A let-down though is the new damper system which, if you can pardon the pun, has put a damper on the KB's trademark car-like ride in making it feel bouncy, with a further hindrance being those alloy wheels wrapped in General Grabber all-terrain tyres, which had the ability to turn smooth tar into an off-road course.

Conclusion

The pickup segment is renowned for its brand loyal perception, which provides a hint as to the KB's ongoing popularity. It feels unashamedly old-school with the sole aim of being more the hard worker than an SUV with a "bak".

At R571 500 though, the KB 300 D-TEQ LX double cab 4x4 is on the pricey side compared to the better equipped and more powerful, albeit low-selling Mazda BT-50 and Mitsubishi Triton, but if a simple leisure vehicle with the minimal luxuries is what you want, the elder statesman has shown that it can still play ball with the Blue Oval and the people's "volks-wagen".

Land Rover ups Range Rover Velar power and spec levels

espite only having been on sale since mid-2017, Land Rover has introduced a series of updates for the smash-hit Velar, with the biggest being two new six-cylinder engines.

On the petrol front, the new P340 slots in between the blown-four P300 and P380, and as its name suggests, produces 340 PS or 250 kW with torque rated at 450 Nm. Like the latter, the new mill displaces 3.0-litres and comes equipped with a supercharger although no performance figures are known so far.

The new oil-burner also displaces 3.0-litres, but drops from 300 PS (221 kW) to 275 PS or 202 kW with torque rated at 625 Nm instead of 700 Nm. Like the P340, no performance details of the D275 were divulged, with Land Rover merely stating that both will continue using the ZF-sourced eight-speed automatic gearbox.

In addition to the powerunits, Land Rover has also upgraded the Velar's equipment list with Driver Condition Monitor, a reverse camera, front and rear parking sensors, Lane Keep Assist and Emergency



Braking standard on all UK models, while Adaptive Cruise Control, Adaptive Dynamic damping and air suspension on all sixcylinder models, including the four-cylinder D240 and P300, are optional.

Also new is a bigger 83-litre petrol tank on

the P250 and P300 models, particle filter on all petrol variants and revised Steering Assist and Lane Centering systems.

No word on the changes making their way to South Africa have yet been made.

Most powerful Golf GTI ever to be called the TCR

outh Africa's best-selling hot hatch, the Golf GTI is set to spawn a more hardcore TCR version, which is based upon the brand's TCR racecar.

Set to be named the Golf GTI TCR, it is set to make its debut at the 2018 Wörthersee Tour, an annual Volkswagen festival in Austria, according to Motor Authority.

The TCR will be the most powerful GTI ever produced, with around 216kW/370Nm from a fa-

miliar 2.0-litre turbocharged four-cylinder motor which is mated to a seven-speed dual-clutch transmission with an electronic front differential. The car is also expected to receive a wider body kit, a more aggressive rear diffuser and a new alloy wheel design. The TCR is likely the final farewell to the current MK7 Golf GTI. More details are expected to be revealed at the Wörthersee show which starts on the 8th of




Time passes quickly and without pause, 7 years have passed us by and each year and every moment without you has been painful daddy.
